My Background (nonprofit)

- 2015 took Boots to Business, Beekeeping classes, etc.
- In July 2017 bought my property, about 10 acres in rural Indiana
- Attend local programs for Veterans in Agriculture under Purdue
- April 2018 planted 200 apple trees-3-5 year to harvest
- April 2019 planted 50 more, About 3 beehives
- Jul 2019-promoted and moved to DC
- DoD Skillbridge in Dec 2021
- Retired Army Colonel-June 2022
- Consultant with AgrAbility-Veteran Outreach-June 2022
- Oct 2022 Spec Crop Grant and SBCG-COVID awarded (\$200K)-two years
 - Failed first time in 2021
- Featured Farmer Indiana Statefair-2023
 - Recommended by Indiana Grown Director
- Purdue Master Gardner
 - Paid for by AgVet Grant

2024-Momentum is picking up

- Jan 2024 Awarded NRCS Equity in Conservation Partnership
 - Made aware of opportunity by NRCS
 - Operation Groundwork supports two Veteran Farms-\$110K per year
 - Farm 2 School Grant-Planning Jun 2024
 - American Farm Bureau Federation Farmer Veteran of the Year Nov 2024
 - Jan 2025, Indiana Dept of Veterans Affairs Nonprofit Partner for 2025

Impact-2024

- Operation Groundwork Donations
 - Donate: 60 dozen eggs, 20 whole chickens, over 60lbs fresh produce to food pantries
 - Almost 30 in person or webinar classes
 - Over 200 Veteran participants in classes
 - 70 attendees Jan 2024 workshop, 80 or more in Jan 2025
- Over 500 new members (total 1600) to non-profits (At Ease Orchard and Veterans IN Farming)
- 3 Veteran Farms in Indiana State Fair Feature Farms in 2024
- Harvested
 - 30 gallons of honey
 - 800 lbs of apples

Where we are today

- 6 part-time employees-4 workers, 3 admin (2-business and social media)
- 3 regular volunteers to support the non-profit
- Strong relationship with Indiana Grown, Indiana Dept of Veterans Affairs, USDA both Nationally and Locally, AgrAbility and Purdue
- Way Ahead
 - AgriVet Challenge (over \$25K to Vet Farms in Indiana)
 - 2 more Veteran Farms

Identify Organization-Empower them!

- Veteran Nonprofit in Agriculture almost every state
 - Skilled and passioned person in charge
 - Check 990's IRS search nonprofits
 - CCUA, FVC Chapter, The Veteran Farm of NC, Arcadia, and VA's
- Helps sell their name, build their credit
 - They may not know the process
- Build into your meetings or process
- Use their name in a grant
- Let them know the process how to get your endorsement

Spiral Growth

- Put in for a loan, grant, whatever now.
 - Don't fear denial, get the comments and build on them!
- Start small and build on it, proof of principle (Army Term-PoP)
- Help them tell their story
- Review and provide comments from your perspective
